Providing Cooling Comfort PACE Supports Family Through Summer Heatwaves

Elaine and her family were referred to PACE by CRIS Healthy Aging after their home's air conditioning failed during extreme summer heat. Because of a medical disability, staying cool was essential, but efforts to find help elsewhere had been unsuccessful. Through our Pull for Access pop-tab fund, PACE purchased two standing fans from Walmart and personally delivered them to the family, providing immediate relief and improved safety.

Elaine expressed sincere gratitude, sharing that PACE was there when they had nowhere else to turn. This support reflects the impact of community partnerships and how together we can make a difference.

Supporting Stability Through Community Partnership



With support from a grant received from the McKinley Foundation, PACE was able to cover the apartment hold fee so Jimmie Dorris could secure a safe, affordable unit in Champaign. Mr. Dorris had been working with us since May 2023 and, after leaving a family member's home in February 2025, he was relying on hotels costing about \$1,000 per month. We're grateful to have been able to assist at this pivotal moment and will continue coordinating with community partners to support a stable move-in. As Mr. Dorris shared, "things are finally starting to come together."

Supporting Safety and Independence at Home



With support from a grant received from the McKinley Foundation, PACE was able to have a grab bar installed for Mrs. Liggett in her bathroom after a fall which made daily tasks unsafe. The modification improved her stability and confidence, helping her remain safely at home. We're grateful for the opportunity to assist and for the partnership that made this possible.


